# 1.General Resources

- **Archives & Records Association UK & Ireland (ARA), Archives for Learning and Education Section (ALES), Useful Links and Resources.** Includes lists of learning organisations and networks to connect with, free educational resources, links to toolkits, guides and training programmes, and information on funding and funding providers.
- **Scottish Council on Archives, Education and Learning.** Provides links to current and past educational projects in Scotland, guides on creating learning resources for schools, and professional development courses in learning and outreach work.
- **The Group for Education in Museums (GEM), Resources.** Links to practical resources used by practitioners in the wider heritage sector, which include schools programmes.



## 2. Classroom-Based Resources

- **Archives & Records Association UK & Ireland (ARA), *Explore Your Archive*, *Archives and Education***. Contains a free, downloadable inspiration pack to help plan classroom activities based around different archive formats. Included are worksheets for document-analysis exercises, split by year groups, with additional teacher notes.
- **Archives & Records Association UK & Ireland (ARA), *Really Useful Resources - the ALES Committee***. A blog containing links to free online and classroom-based resources created by different archives and heritage institutions.
- **Ancestry Classroom**. Platform for educators to access a variety of primary records in Ancestry's collections for use in the curriculum.
